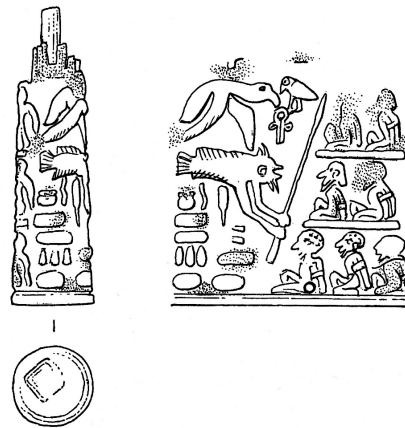
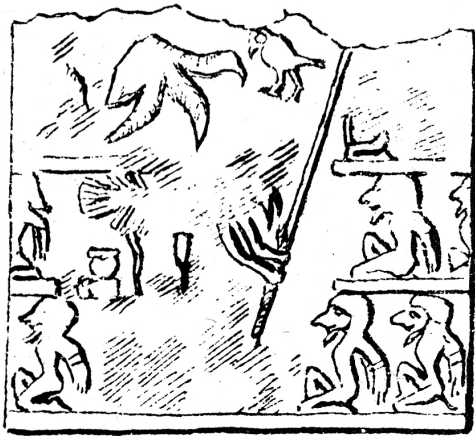

Comments

Kaplony (1963: 6) and Regulski classify this object as a seal (cylinder). This seems unlikely, because it is slightly tapered and still contains part of what it was attached to. It is more likely that it is a handle for a small object (Whitehouse 1992: 78).



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
