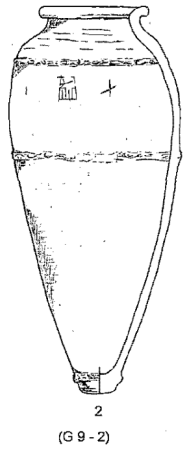

Comments

Jucha 2010a and 2010b (2008) identify the inscription as “Narmer (?)”. Dębowska-Ludwin 2012 identifies it as Narmer. In Jucha 2010a, it says “The pottery assemblage of that grave [grave 9] includes vessels characteristic of the reign of Narmer.” This dating supports the interpretation of the inscription as a Narmer *serekh*. It is further confirmed by the fact that it shows the three “whiskers” characteristic of catfish in Narmer inscriptions.
